Old Testament Reading

Genesis 15.1-6

¹ After these things the word of the
LORD came to Abram in a vision, 'Do
not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield;
your reward shall be very great.' ² But
Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you
give me, for I continue childless, and
the heir of my house is Eliezer of
Damascus?' ³ And Abram said, 'You
have given me no offspring, and so a
slave born in my house is to be my
heir.' ⁴ But the word of the LORD came
to him, 'This man shall not be your
heir; no one but your very own issue
shall be your heir.' ⁵ He brought him
outside and said, 'Look towards heaven
and count the stars, if you are able to
count them.' Then he said to him, 'So
shall your descendants be.' ⁶ And he
believed the LORD; and the LORD
reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Gospel Reading Luke 12.32-40

³² 'Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is
your Father's good pleasure to give
you the kingdom. ³³ Sell your
possessions, and give alms. Make
purses for yourselves that do not wear
out, an unfailing treasure in heaven,
where no thief comes near and no
moth destroys. ³⁴ For where your
treasure is, there your heart will be
also.

³⁵ 'Be dressed for action and have your
lamps lit; ³⁶ be like those who are
waiting for their master to return from
the wedding banquet, so that they may
open the door for him as soon as he
comes and knocks. ³⁷ Blessed are
those slaves whom the master finds
alert when he comes; truly I tell you,
he will fasten his belt and have them
sit down to eat, and he will come and
serve them. ³⁸ If he comes during the
middle of the night, or near dawn, and
finds them so, blessed are those
slaves.

³⁹ 'But know this: if the owner of the
house had known at what hour the
thief was coming, he would not have
let his house be broken into. ⁴⁰ You
also must be ready, for the Son of Man
is coming at an unexpected hour.'
