#### **RECEIVING COMMUNION**

Recently a number of questions have arisen concerning the administration of communion, so it seems appropriate to set out what we can and cannot do.

There are only three permitted ways of receiving Communion in the Church of England. 1) Bread alone; 2) Bread and then wine from a communal cup; 3) "Simultaneous administration", where the priest dips the wafer into the wine and places that on the hand of the person receiving communion.

Intincting or dipping your own wafer in the communal cup, ceased to be an option, before the arrival of Covid, for a number of reasons.

Individual cups have never been allowed in the Church of England and are not an option.

At present both church congregations receive bread alone. Any possible changes would need to be decided by the PCCs.

#### **FURTHER EASING OF COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS WITH EFFECT FROM SUNDAY 5<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2021**

Thank- you for completing the latest survey in order for us to plan ahead for our weekly services. As from Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> September when we welcome back our 'All age Family Praise' service at 10am, the following changes will be made, however, we still ask all adults to wear face coverings whilst inside church.

- We will no longer be keeping a register of attendance.
- Service booklets and hymn books will be handed to you by a sides-person.
- We will continue to sing hymns wearing face masks and the number of hymns that are sung may increase over the coming weeks starting at our All-Age Family Praise Service. The singing of the Gloria may also be included.
- The first 3 front rows of pews will be open and available for seating.
- The other pews will remain as they are now – alternate. You may sit where you prefer and use an orange card if you wish to socially distance.

- Holy Communion will remain the receiving of bread only.
- At the present time, the serving of coffee after services is suspended. We do not have volunteers prepared to serve coffee at present and the ability to socially distance is difficult to manage.
- The present arrangements will be reviewed at the end of September with a further survey. At that time there will be more questions on how the congregation feels about the receiving of Communion in both forms.

We understand that while this is welcome news for many people there are others for whom this will be an increased time of anxiety. We do not wish to exclude anyone from attending, so if you have any concerns, please speak to Sue or Lyn.

We will do everything we can to ensure that everyone worships safely in our church.

**St John's procedures** will remain as they are and will be reviewed at the end of September.
